

STATEMENT OF MISREPRESENTATION

Webb Institute is committed to fostering a community of the highest integrity. Further, Webb Institute is prohibited under federal regulations (CFR title 34 sections 668.71-74) from making any false, erroneous, or misleading statements directly or indirectly to a student, prospective student, member of the public, accrediting agency, state agency, or the U. S. Department of Education.

Misrepresentation is defined as any false, erroneous or misleading statement an eligible institution, one of its representatives, or any ineligible institution, organization, or person with whom the eligible institution has an agreement to provide educational programs, or to provide marketing, advertising, recruiting or admissions services makes directly or indirectly to a student, prospective student or any member of the public, or to an accrediting agency, to a State agency, or to the Secretary. A misleading statement includes any statement that has the likelihood or tendency to deceive or confuse. A statement is any communication made in writing, visually, orally, or through other means. Misrepresentation includes the dissemination of a student endorsement or testimonial that a student gives either under duress or because the institution required the student to make such an endorsement or testimonial to participate in a program.

The federal regulatory provisions prohibit misrepresentation by the school itself, one of its representatives, or other related parties, with respect to: (a) the nature of the education programs offered through Webb Institute; (b) the nature of financial charges, fees, and other costs; (c) the employability of graduates of Webb Institute; and (d) the relationship of Webb Institute with the U. S. Department of Education.

Webb Institute will make every effort to avoid misrepresentation of information to students and others and takes acts and claims of misrepresentation seriously.
