Centered around the historic Stevenson Taylor Hall and the new state-of-the-art Couch Academic Center, Webb's vibrant campus community of approximately 100 undergraduate students work collaboratively with their peers, faculty, administration, and staff to complete a rigorous four-year, 146-credit undergraduate program. A suite of science and engineering laboratories supports student learning as well as undergraduate and faculty research. The academic program's balanced treatment of the theoretical and practical is reinforced by Webb's unique annual winter work program that results in all students acquiring at least eight months of industry experience by the time of graduation. By design, all faculty members are highly accessible to students, serving as course instructors, academic advisers, thesis advisers, and career mentors.

Webb's full-tuition scholarship program together with generous financial aid packages and the highly respected engineering program attracts very capable, dedicated, and hardworking engineering students. Webb seniors regularly have a 100% pass rate on the FE exam and 100% job placement soon after graduation. Webb is committed to fostering a diverse and inclusive campus environment. All Webb students live and work on the campus under a strong student governance and honor code model. With six intercollegiate sports and many other social and cultural activities to choose from, Webb's campus environment inspires our students to pursue personal passions while building their academic, social, and leadership skills.

Interested faculty candidates should possess a

A minimum of a master's degree in engineering or a science is required. Previous teaching experience is preferred, but not required. Practical industry experience and/or research experience are valued, as are earned doctoral degrees.

Well-qualified candidates with experience in ship design and the application of sustainability principles to marine systems may be considered for the endowed title of The John C. Couch Professor in Sustainable Ship Design.

Faculty Duties

- Teach two to three courses for a total of six to nine credit hours each 18-week semester.
- Provide regular on-campus office hours to support students.
- Serve as a laboratory or shop director as assigned.
- Actively participate on faculty committees and on college shared governance committees.
- Contribute to program and college accreditation processes.
- Pursue regular professional development opportunities in pedagogy and areas of expertise.
- Engage in the activities of the campus community.

Compensation & Benefits

Webb Institute offers competitive salaries, a generous benefits package, and a stimulating, collaborative working environment. Webb Institute provides financial support to faculty members' professional development activities and professional society participation. Faculty members are provided one class-free professional day during the semesters. On campus faculty housing may be available. Salary is between \$100,000 and \$150,000 commensurate with experience.
